Evaluation Questions

Your evaluation of your art activity with children should include written answers to the following questions:

How many children participated? Who were they-- i.e. boys, girls, younger, older, etc.?

What did the children do? How did it compare with what you wanted them to do or anticipated they would do?

What did you do? What did you say or do to attract the children, to enrich their experience, and to maintain their interest?

How did the experience compare with your objectives for the children? Did your objectives change in any way? What factors contributed to achieving your objectives? What factors detracted?

If you were to do it again, how could you enhance the factors that contributed? What could you do about the factors that detracted?

How did you activity help enhance the children's creativity? Self-expression?

How did the experience compare with your objectives for yourself?

Please note: An activity that seems unsuccessful in the sense that children do not participate or do not participate in the way you planned for them to is not a failure! I will be grading you on your effort and evaluation and not on how many children participated.
