#### Theme is...

- The main idea of your story.
- Universal truth about the human condition.
- A viewpoint about life and how people behave.
- The element that brings meaning and resonance to your story.

Express your theme as a DECLARATIVE SENTENCE

## **PLOT**

- It's what happens in the story
- It asks the central question
- It's presents the hero with the "Cs": challenges, conflicts, complications and choices
- It's how theme is unveiled
- It's how character is revealed

#### Three Act Structure

- Act I: Set Up: Who, What, When, Why?
  - Intros the normal world
  - Presents the "Inciting Incident"
  - Ends by posing central question

#### Three Act Structure

- Act II (a & b): Confrontation: Rising Stakes
  - Challenges
  - Conflicts
  - Complications
  - Choices

#### Three Act Structure

- Act III: Resolution: New Reality
- Final battle between Protagonist and Antagonist
- Protagonist learns the vital lesson
- Resolution of the central question
- New normal

Plot vs. Plot Points

The plot is a chain of connected events that comprises the narrative.

# Plot point

A plot point is a link in that chain that directly impacts what happens next in a story.

- Moves the story in a different direction
- Impacts character development
- Forces character to make a choice
- Reveals something important

## This...

This happened, so this happened, but then this happened, therefore this happened.

# Not This:

This happened, and then this happened, and then this happened, And so did this.

# Plot versus Story

- Plot is what the hero says he/she wants
- Plot is what happens in the external world
- Plot is conscious -- "seen"

# Plot versus Story

- Story is what the hero needs
- Story is the internal journey of the character
- Story is unconscious -- "unseen"
